



Sports Premium Funding

The government is spending over £450 million on improving physical education (PE) and sport in primary schools over the next three academic years 2013 to 2014, 2014 to 2015 and 2015 to 2016.

Schools can choose how they use the funding. Here at Eagle CP School we want our funding:

- to provide high quality opportunities for sport;
- to create a legacy for improved quality of teaching across the school;
- and to ensure the school is equipped to provide varied sport opportunities.

We have achieved this by using the Sports Premium to fund:

Academic Year 2013-2014 £8380

- Employing qualified coaches for games and swimming to deliver high quality, quality assured provision
- Employing qualified coaches to work alongside teachers during lessons to build knowledge and confidence
- Employing specialists to provide professional development training to increase competence and confidence
- Release PE Lead from class to attend professional development PE leadership opportunities with other PE Leads for development and networking
- Linking with our collaboration of schools for sports events and competitions
- Transport, pool hire and instruction for swimming
- Purchasing specialist equipment for outdoor/adventurous activities

IMPACT 2013-2014

- Specialists ensure that skills are delivered correctly with the development of associated vocabulary
- Teachers feel supported through experiencing the modelling of lessons delivered by specialists, which they can use and springboard from in the future
- Teachers report that they have fresh ideas of how to plan sequences of lessons to reach a performance goal
- Leadership of PE has been developed more widely across the school
- Competitions and events have been well received by parents and pupils alike and support action towards suggestions for such opportunities from our stakeholders
- All Key Stage 2 pupils completed a full term of swim tuition
- New equipment has been well received by parents and pupils alike and is being used in lessons, breaks and after school.

Academic Year 2014-2015 £8375

IMPACT 2014-2015

- PE assessment twilight courses with ideas and resources and advice to support teachers in their assessment of PE.
- Dance training twilights developed teachers knowledge of indoor warm-ups linking specifically to dance techniques ~ these were provided with useful cue-cards for lesson development.
- Mentoring led to increased confidence in teaching the techniques and terminology of dance. Schemes of work were developed with staff so they could see how their own planning could use this as a model.
- Increased confidence led to dance events with the NEST network, NK Dance Festival and a Streetdance Arts Project.
- MSP coaching was planned into the curriculum against the teacher's second hour of PE delivery. This was extended to include intra-whole school competitions and inter-school competitions with the NEST network.

- Arts Award training to continue to develop skills in the Arts
- Collaboration of schools to choreograph routines for a stage performance
- Linking with our collaboration of schools for sports events and competitions
- 40 hours of Sports Coaching
