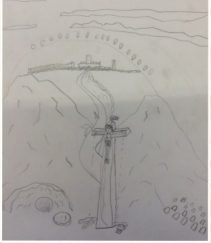

'He Is Risen!'

An Easter Performance written and performed by Class 3

Overview:

This project was driven through English, Drama, RE, Music and Technology.

The children were reminded of the Easter story through examining and discussing famous pieces of Art depicting the Easter story, including the Last Supper (da Vinci), The Agony (El Greco), Carrying the Cross (Bosch), Crucifixion (Mantegna), Lamentation (di Bondone) and others. These were later to be used to inspire the cover art for our play.

The children learned about the Easter story through the 15 stations of the cross and based on these written performance/narrative/conversation poetry as part of the Easter Performance.

Together we selected, learned and rehearsed songs, evaluated music and matched it to mood, developed our reading and performance skills, working on our expression and intonation.

Children worked on computing skills and experience to record voiceovers and perform in front of 'Green Screen' to develop a simple film version of the performance.

Facilitator Reflection:

This has been a wonderful project. The children embraced the idea of putting on their own show. From the conception, through the writing and refining of the words, rehearsal of songs to the final performance. It has been a pleasure to watch the children grown through individual and collaborative performance. One parent described the final show as 'a triumph'.
